





On Monday, Our Grade 1 students participated in an excursion to the Discovery Centre. The purpose of the excursion was to enhance and support learning about the earth and space.






On August 22nd The Blurbs will be returning to Strathfieldsaye Primary to put on an amazing performance for all the children.

The Blurbs are a band of book enthusiasts who encourage children to read though the power of performance and music.


The Blurbs venture out from the library rarely, but when they do, they put on a spectacular show for primary schools during 'Book Week'

The show contains original songs about books that have been short listed by the CBCA for the 'Book of the Year' awards.




















LOTE

In Chinese class, students had the chance to experience painting and writing with traditional Chinese tools. Junior students used brushes to write the numbers they had learned, discovering the special qualities of traditional materials like animal hair used in the brushes.

For grade 5-6 students, the experience was even more exciting as they made traditional plum blossom paintings using the ink blowing method. This method, where they blew ink across the paper to create delicate branches, let students see the beauty of traditional Chinese art and learn about its history and culture. The plum blossom, which blooms in winter, stood for strength and perseverance. Chinese artists had long admired its spirit, often showing it in their art to express themes of endurance and hope. These hands-on activities not only reinforced their learning but also introduced them to the cultural importance of traditional Chinese art.
























Mathematic and Numeracy at Home






School Canteen Information




