Principal's Report

School Saving Bonus Information In Term 4, 2024, families with a child enrolled in a government school from Prep to Year 12 in 2025 will receive the one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus. The \$400 School Saving Bonus provides families with support for education-related costs, such as school activities and/or school uniforms and textbooks. The School Saving Bonus is not available for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.

Actions for parents and carers Before 18 Oct 2024, the Department of Education is asking parents and carers to:

- Complete enrolment: If your child, or children are changing government school for Term 1 2025, or starting Prep or Year 7 in 2025. For more information, read about Enrolling in School.
- Check your contact information: Ensure your email address and phone number is up to date with us. You can check this information by contacting us directly.

We need to ensure your contact information is up to date as the Department of Education will email you twice: in October, to verify your email address in November, with your \$400 School Saving Bonus and access to an online system. Please check your junk mail regularly to make sure you do not miss an important email. Australia's Biggest Child Safety Lessons The award-winning Australia's Biggest Child Safety Lesson (ABCSL) is back to deliver important safety messages to children, for its eighth consecutive year. The 2024 livestreamed lesson will teach early primary years - aged 4 to 7 - enthusiastic consent, and upper primary years aged 8 to 12 - affirmative consent. ABCSL will be livestreamed to hundreds of thousands of students on 3 September 2024 and most of our students will participate in the lesson either during the live streaming or at a different time throughout the National Child Protection Week.

Building on what students learnt in 2023 about consent, ABCSL 2024 will provide an easy way for teachers, parents and carers to have conversations about enthusiastic and affirmative consent confidently with children. Free readymade age appropriate resources and lessons will explore how to recognise, react and report and practice strategies to use to receive or deny consent affirmatively. Some of these resources also include information related to the correct names for body parts and other sensitive but information. If you would like any further information regarding these lessons, please contact your child's classroom teacher.


PRIMARY MATHEMATICS AND SCIENCE SPECIALIST INITIATIVE



Using Mobile Devices to Encourage Mathematical Thinking in Children


There are many applications (apps) available for mobile devices (e.g.< Phone, tablet, iPad). Many generic apps come with these devices, while others may be downloaded from app stores. We recommend FREE apps, best downloaded while connected to WIFI. Look for the Lite version of apps. This is a good way to try an app for free and then upgrade for a small cost if you feel the app is exactly what you are looking for. The suggestions below are for apps that come with the most devices:

- Go to the app store and search the category Sports for those of interest to your child. Exploring and comparing team and individual results can be quite mathematical.
- Using the Camera App, your child could photograph everyday objects and sort them into similar shapes take a photo of one object from different views: (e.g. above, front, side) or take a sequence of photos as an event is occurring (e.g. building a tower with blocks) and then challenge the family to place them in the order they might have been taken.
- Maps Apps -Your children can use these apps to plan the route to their next party or outing with the family.
- Calendar Apps- We live our lives around our calendar, so children must understand its structure. Have your child add family events to the calendar.
- Weather Apps Children can check the weather app a week/day before some event to assist in planning.
















Blurbs Performance




School Canteen Information


- The school canteen operates on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday between 11:20—12pm & 2pm-2.30pm



THE ATHLETE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM 2025

The Athlete Development Program is a select-entry program available to all students enrolled (or intending to enrol) at any of the Bendigo Education Plan Government Secondary Colleges. This includes Bendigo Senior Secondary College, Bendigo South East College, Crusoe College, Eaglehawk Secondary College and Weeroona College Bendigo.

We offer programs in AFL, Athletics, Basketball, Cricket, Cycling (TBC), Netball and Soccer.

All coaching and physical training is carried out by highly qualified and professional staff who already monitor workload and wellbeing. Student-athletes in the ADP are held to requirements to retain their position. These are based around academic and behavioural standards, attendance, and effort. All of these requirements are identified in the Student-Athlete Agreement which every member of the program signs when accepting a place in the program.






